# **Ringette BC Update**

The month of March is generally a very busy and exciting time in ringette - Provincial Championships are underway and teams are preparing to compete at the Western Canadian Ringette Championships and the Canadian Ringette Championships. Coaches, parents and players start to say their goodbyes and attend their season wind-ups.

And while it was a year ago that our 2019/20 season ended abruptly. It still feels like there unfinished business as the 2020/21 season now comes to an end. Ringette BC would like to acknowledge and recognize that, while this was not a banner season, it will be one no one will ever forget. Thank you to all the coaches, volunteers, players and families who 'rolled with the punches' and adapted as changes felt never-ending. Your resiliency, patience and understanding has been remarkable.

As the vaccine roll out gets underway, Ringette BC is hopeful that there will be some opportunities for "normalcy" in the coming months as we look forward to the season ahead.

## **COVID-19 Restrictions remain in place**

While some good news was released on March 11 that allow for gatherings of up to 10 people outdoors; all other restrictions remain in place; including those as they relate to Sport.

While Ringette BC is hopeful that there may be changes in the coming weeks, Sport in BC remains under Phase 2 of the *Return to Sport Guidelines* and Ringette Progression 2 under the Ringette BC *Return to Ringette Guidelines*.

The current restrictions for ringette include:

- All adult ringette programming (18+ and Masters) is suspended for anyone 22 years of age and older;
- All Youth and Children divisions (FUNdamentals to U19) remain in *Ringette Progression 2* as per the *Return to Ringette Guidelines*;
- Physical distancing requires all participants must stay three (3) meters apart;
- Masks are mandatory in all public indoor spaces except on the field of play;
- Spectators are not permitted; and
- Team Travel for sport is suspended.

## **Updates for the 2021-2022 Ringette Season**

#### **Evaluations**

Ringette BC will be developing resource materials and webinar training to accompany the standardized evaluation criteria to support Club Associations with their evaluations for the upcoming season. Stay tuned for more information coming this summer.

#### Zone Teams

Ringette BC will be developing a package of materials to support Club Associations with operational assistance and management of Zone teams.

In addition, Ringette BC will be updating the Player Movement Policy to make the process for Zone player movement requests easier to administrate.

## Rule Changes and Refresher Clinics

Ringette Canada has officially shifted the rule change calendar to fall on even years. As such, the 2019-2021 Rule Book and all applicable rule changes remain unchanged for the 2021/22 ringette season. In addition, Officials will not be required to attend a Refresher Clinic in the fall to maintain active status as an official with Ringette Canada and Ringette BC. The next rule change year will be in 2022.



## Season-end Survey

Ringette BC will be releasing a survey shortly seeking input on the experience that our players, coaches, volunteers and parents had over the course of the 2020-2021 ringette season.
